


PRAYER & DISCIPLESHIP

Did you know that we have numerous options for prayer here at St Johns?



We have a monthly prayer diary that you can subscribe to by emailing the office on <u>office@stjohnshythe.org</u>. But you can also receive prayer on Sundays. Just ask one of the service leaders, or someone you trust if they wouldn't mind praying for you, and I'm sure they'd be delighted!

Many of us follow our own routine for daily prayer, and over the next few editions, I'd like to highlight some of the resources that are out there to aid you in your prayer life and walk with God.

The first one is **Lectio365**, which is a free daily prayer app from 247-Prayer; with morning, midday & night devotionals to help you experience God's presence in your life. For more information and links to download, visit www.lectio364.com There's even a Lectio for families with accessible reflections.

The origins

Created to help you develop a deeper, daily connection with God.

Inspired by the ancient practice of Lectio Divina, daily devotionals guide users to pray the Bible through Scripture, reflection, and prayer each morning, midday and evening. Since launching in 2019, Lectio 365 has helped thousands of people make prayer a regular, life-giving habit – wherever they are and whatever their day holds.





P.R.A.Y.

Lectio 365 prayers are inspired by the ancient practice of Lectio Divina (which means 'Divine Reading'), a way of meditating on the Bible that's been used by Christians for centuries.

Pause, breathe deeply, and be still in God's presence

Rejoice with a Psalm and reflect on Scripture

Ask God to help you and those you care about

Yield to God; welcome his love, his plans and his presence into your day.

On Sundays, we take a break from the normal routine to pray a different kind of Sabbath prayer.

The app celebrates heroes of faith on Feast Days, marks significant moments in the church calendar, and welcomes guest hosts throughout the year.

OUR NEW BISHOPS COMMISSION FOR MISSION: WORSHIP!

My name is Veronica! For the best part of 50 years I have worshiped at St. Johns and a lot of that time served a choir member.

I was born in Marchwood and at the age of 10 just after my brother was born we were moved to Netley View Estate.

I was brought up in a mixed faith as my mother was a Roman Catholic and my father was Welsh Chapel, so things could get a bit confusing! As a child, along with my 3 elder sisters I attended St Johns in Marchwood, the Baptist church and The Pentecostal Mission.

On Special religious days, our mother would take us the Catholic Church in Totton. Most of the time I think it as to keep us out of our parents way, but that sowed a seed in me. As I grew up I always had a pull to come into the church, sometimes just to sit and be still.

Peter and I were married in St. Johns in the nineteen sixties by the Reverend Hobbs, we were his first wedding and Peter's Auntie Winn was in the choir. We have three daughters, 5 grandchildren, and to add to the brood we have 7 great grandchildren, whose ages range from 19 to one year, so we're a busy family.

It was in 1996 that I was first approached by the then vicar The Rev Paul Baird, he thought it

would be good for me and St. Johns if I were more involved! We spoke about me becoming a licensed lay minister, but no! I used the excuse of being too busy with family, full-time work (I was a nurse) and Peter's business. I also had a major problem in my life that needed addressing. This I had help with and to this day I remain sober.

I did get more involved in church life with readings, leading prayers and I joined the PCC! Added to that, there was fundraising for the new hall and then being on the hall committee. I still ignored the higher request to take this further....Fast forward to 2024 and the call was still there, more and more I heard the voice in my head or just getting a strong feeling I was being



asked to do more.

Sue Blomley gently persuaded me to get more involved in the services and then broached the subject of doing some training! That idea came just at the right time. I mentioned this to Lee, and after a home visit with Lee and with Peter's blessing, and the PCC's support; I applied for my Bishops Commission for Mission training, and was accepted!

I started my training in January this year, this was daunting at first, it had been such a long time since I last studied. Our first session was at Old Alresford Place where I met some lovely people, whom will remain great friends. There were also zoom meetings and long discussions. Once I got over my impostor syndrome I realised I was actually enjoying myself. I came to believe I was where I should be. It pushed me sometimes, but on the whole I learned so much about myself. You are never too old to learn new things. On March 22nd this year; I completed the course.

On Saturday 11th October I attended a service in Winchester Cathedral to receive my Commission from the Bishop of Winchester; This was a very emotional service, all the candidates were made to feel very welcome, and processing out of the Cathedral afterwards out into the sunshine seemed very fitting.

Some of you will have been part of the services I have officiated at, and I hope you found something helpful in them. I have been asked, "what I can do now", my answer. "With the Lords Help, anything is possible. Watch this space".

I would like to thank all the people who have supported me in this journey, The Rev. Paul Baird, Lee, the PCC and all the members of the wider family of St. John's. Not forgetting Susan Blomley.....Last but never least my husband Peter, without whom my story would have been very different.

There will be a collection trolley on Sundays in Church and midweek, in the hall entrance.






WELCOME OUR NEW BISHOP OF BASINGSTOKE



Good News Family Bible - We have presented bibles to these families and will be offering them a chance to join together and explore them as a family with other families.


Bubble Church Truth Cards - a new resource to equip parents and children to keep growing in their faith at home, especially where they might be beginning a journey of faith together.
